Current Enrollment Numbers:

Total enrollment for academic year 2017-18: **884** students.

Undergraduate students: **591** (Full-time undergraduates: 543; Part-time undergraduates: 48)

Graduate students: **293** (Full-time graduate students: 101; Part-time graduate students: 192)

Percent of Entering Students receiving Advanced Placement credit: 12% received AP credit for Fall 2017.

Student Demographic by Ethnic Group: 36.5% Hispanic; 21.3% African-American; 22.6% Caucasian; 9.7% Asian; 1.7% Hawaiian/Pacific Islander; 0.5% Native-American; 3.6% International; 4.0% Other.

Student Gender: 69% Female, 31% Male.

Student Citizenship: 96.4% U.S. Citizens, 3.6% Non-U.S. Citizens.

Percent of Students living on/off campus: 46% live on campus, 54% live off campus.

Governance Structure: A 20-member Board of Trustees governs HNU. Members are affiliated with the legal profession, education, banking, corporate and community leadership, and Sisters of the Holy Names. Key diversity factors include: 66% Female and 33% Male; 83% Caucasian, 13% African American, and 4% Hispanic. One-third of current trustees are Sisters of the Holy Names (SNJM).

Graduation and Retention: Fall-to-Fall retention: 81% (first-year cohort). Four-year graduation rate: 34% (2013 cohort); Six-year graduation rate: 40% (2011 cohort).

Financial Information for Academic Year 2017-18:

Current Annual Tuition: Traditional Undergraduates: \$37,672; Adult Undergraduates: \$724 per unit;

Graduate Students: \$1003 per unit; Fees: \$516 per year (traditional undergraduates and graduate students). **Annual Cost of on-campus Room and Board:** \$13,228 per year.

Percent of Undergraduate Students who *qualify* for Financial Aid: For 2017-18 academic year, 99% of traditional undergraduate students, and 100% of adult undergraduates, qualified for financial aid.

Percent of Undergraduate Students who *receive* need-based Financial Aid in any form: 90% of HNU undergraduates accepted need-based financial aid, including scholarships, loans, and work-study grants.
