ARTICULATION AGREEMENT FOR GENERAL EDUCATION REQUIREMENTS

Based on Contra Costa College 2018-2019 Catalog and Holy Names University 2018-2019 Catalog

Holy Names University accepts coursework passed with a grade of C- or higher, up to a total of 70 community college units. Generally, community college courses are transferred according to California State University guidelines. Remedial (basic skills) and vocational courses are non-transferable. Each course can be used to meet only one general education requirement.

Students who are certified as having completed the Intersegmental General Education Transfer Curriculum (IGETC) prior to transfer are not required to take additional lower-division general education coursework at HNU. These students would need to only take 2 upper-division ISAC (Integrative Studies Across Cultures) courses plus the Senior Colloquium (see page 2).
