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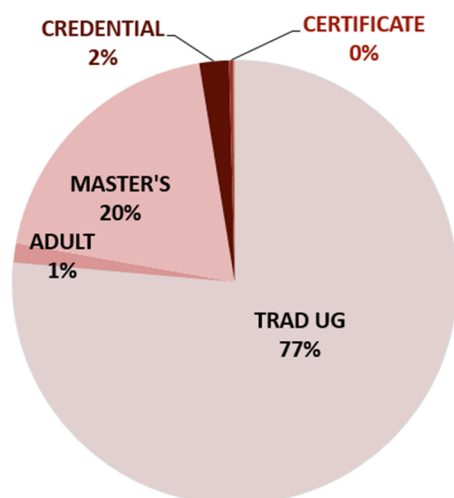

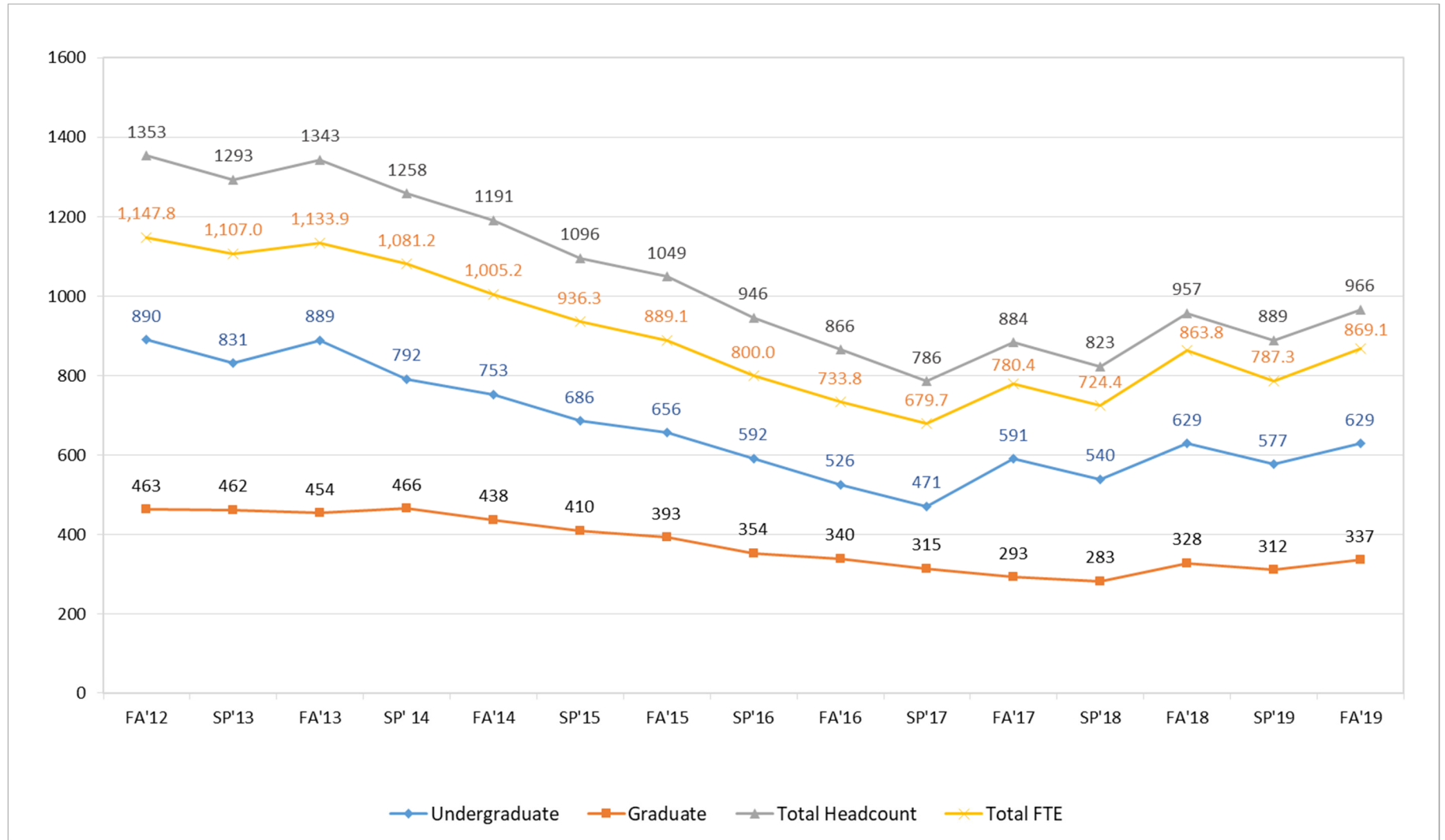

# Holy Names University Enrollment – Fall and Spring Semesters

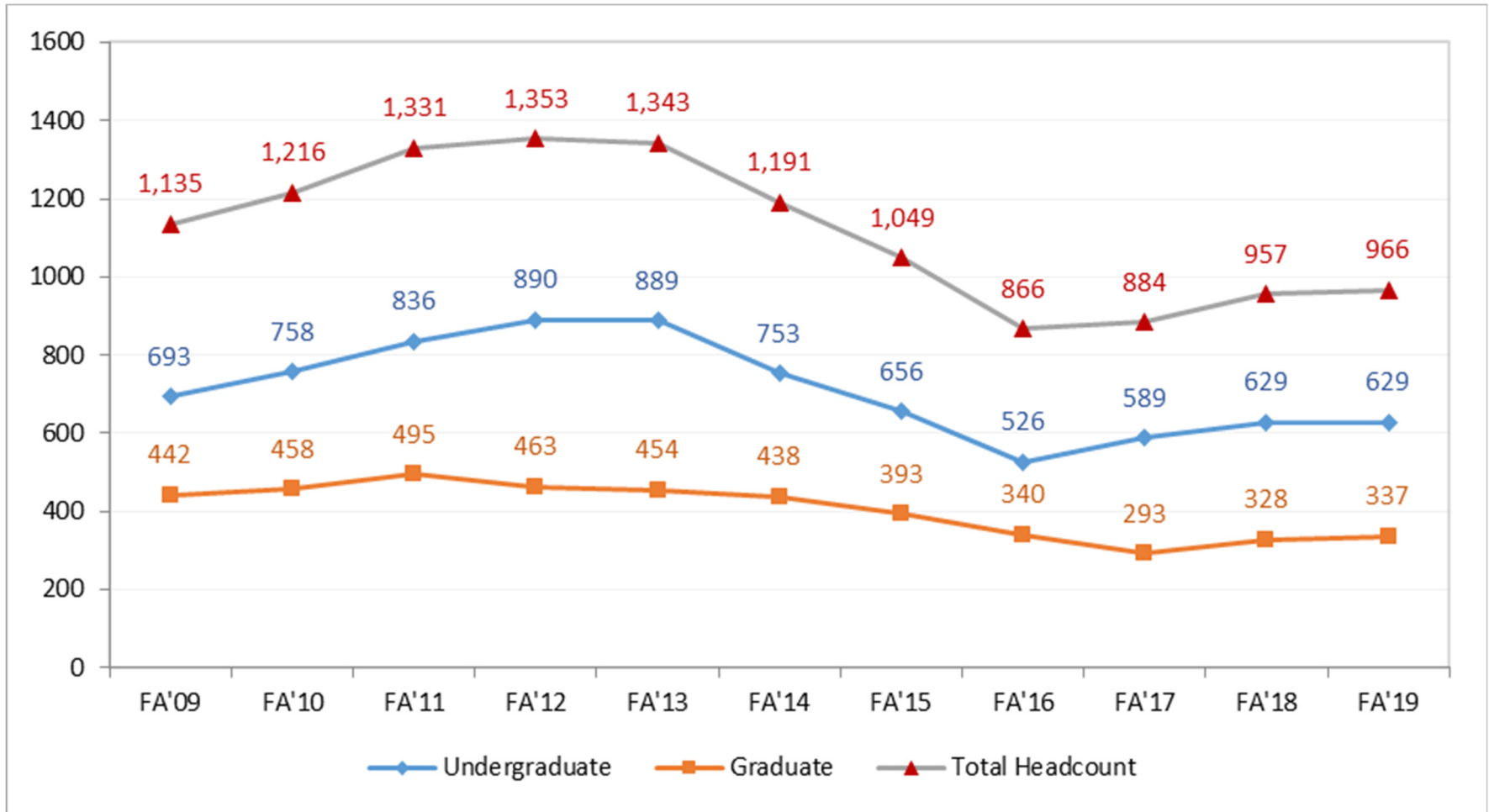

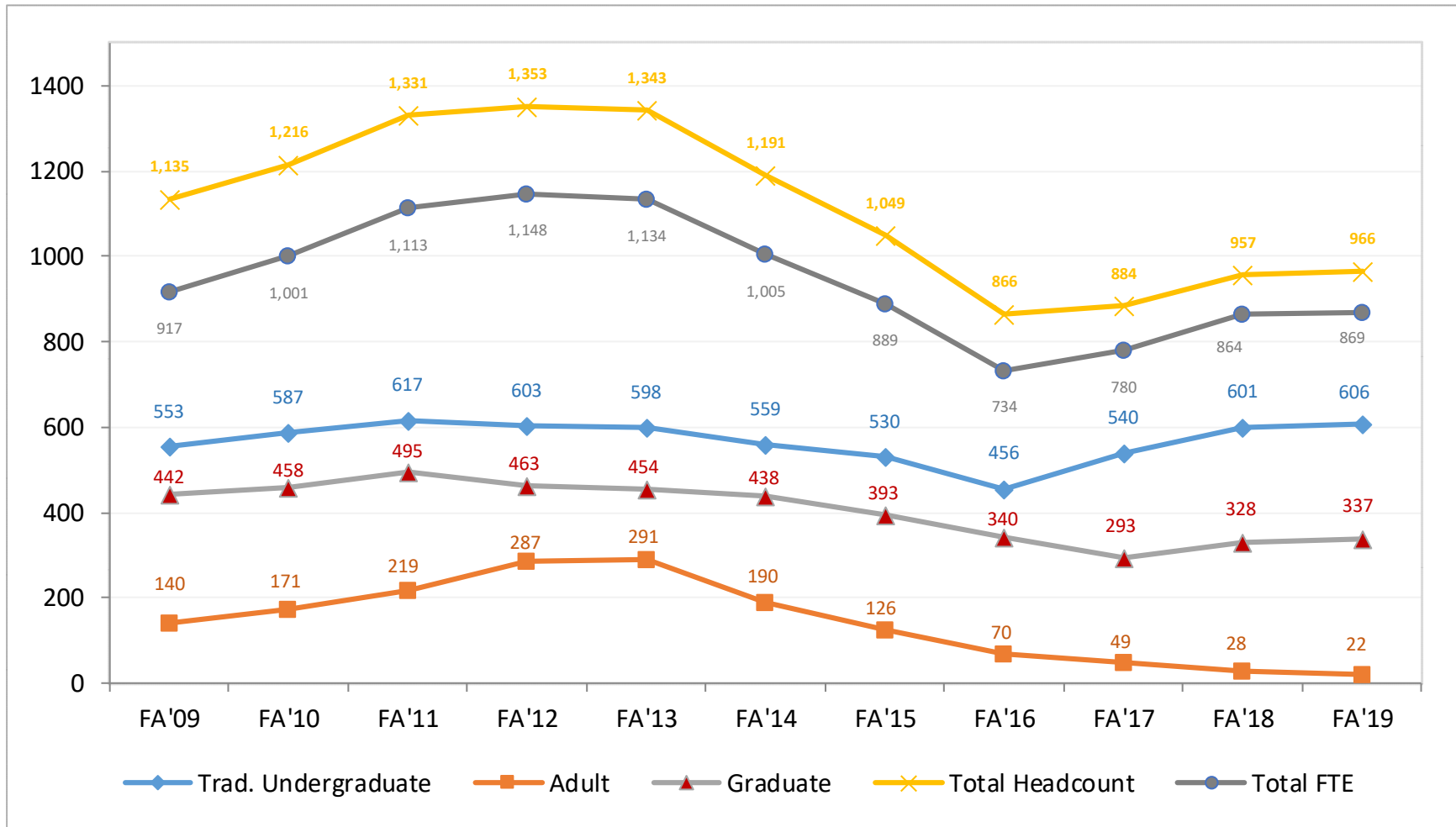
## HNU Fall Enrollment (Fall Semesters Only)

Fall 2009 to Fall 2019



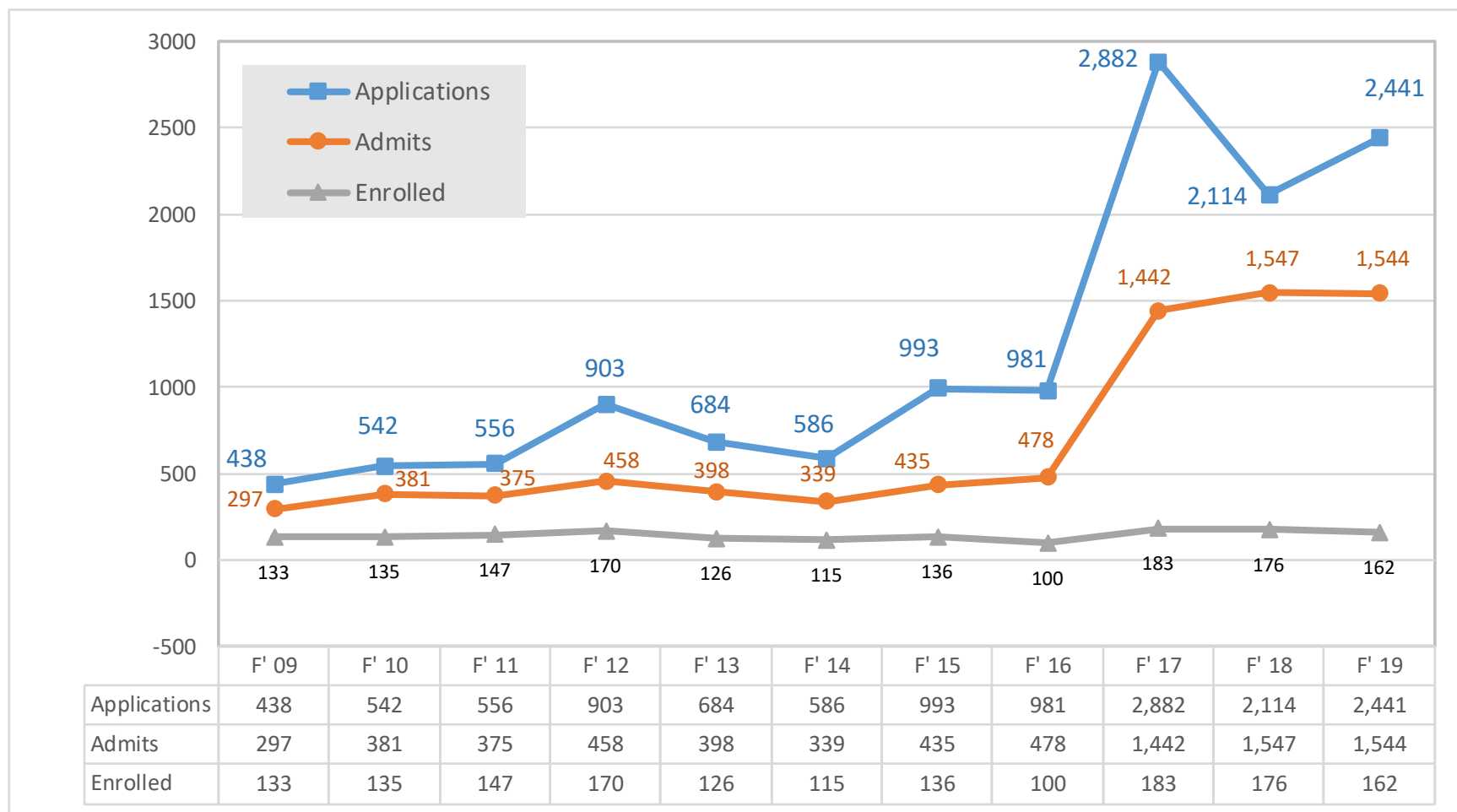
# HNU Enrollment and Full Time Equivalent (Fall Semesters Only)

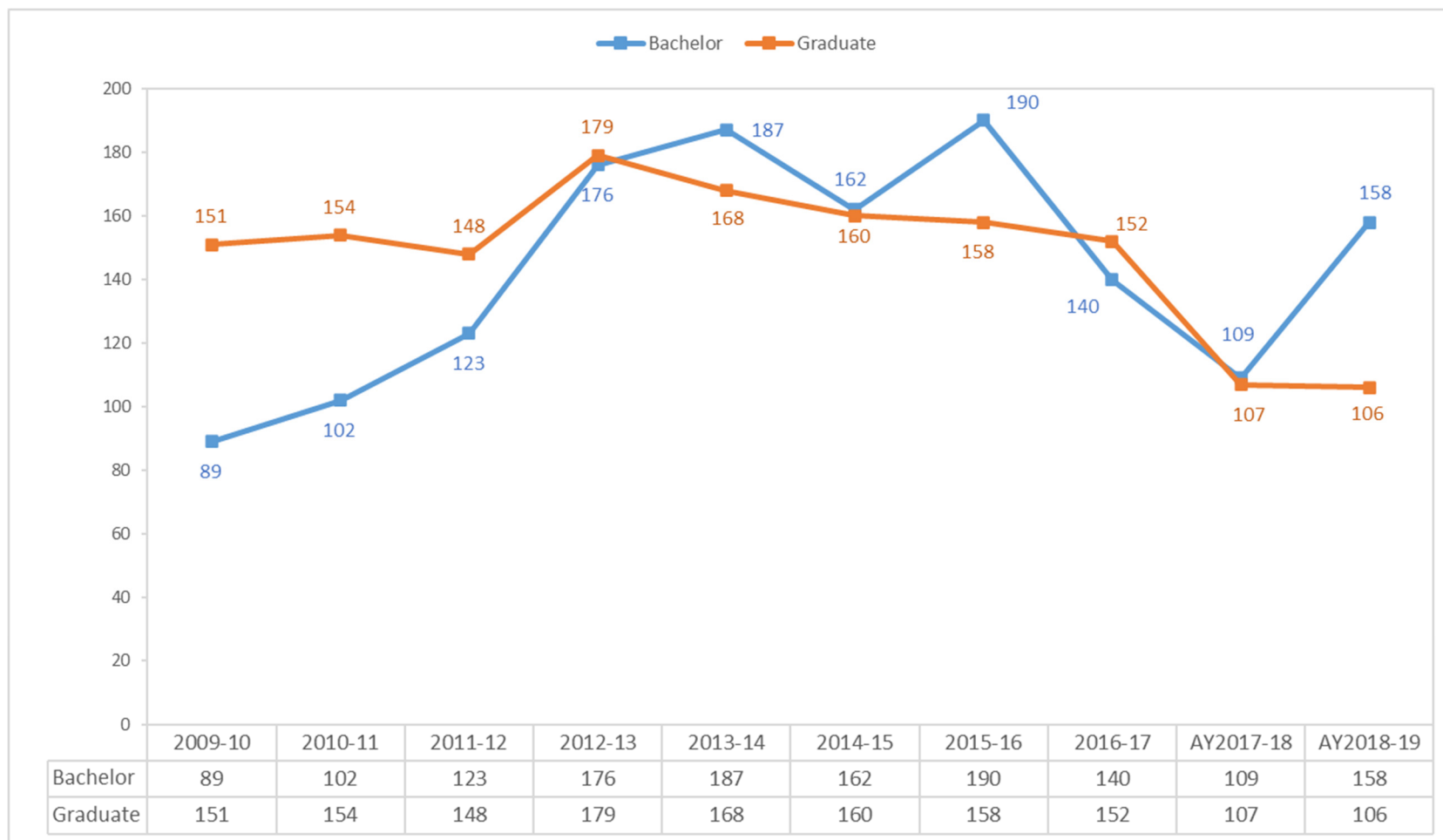

Academic Year



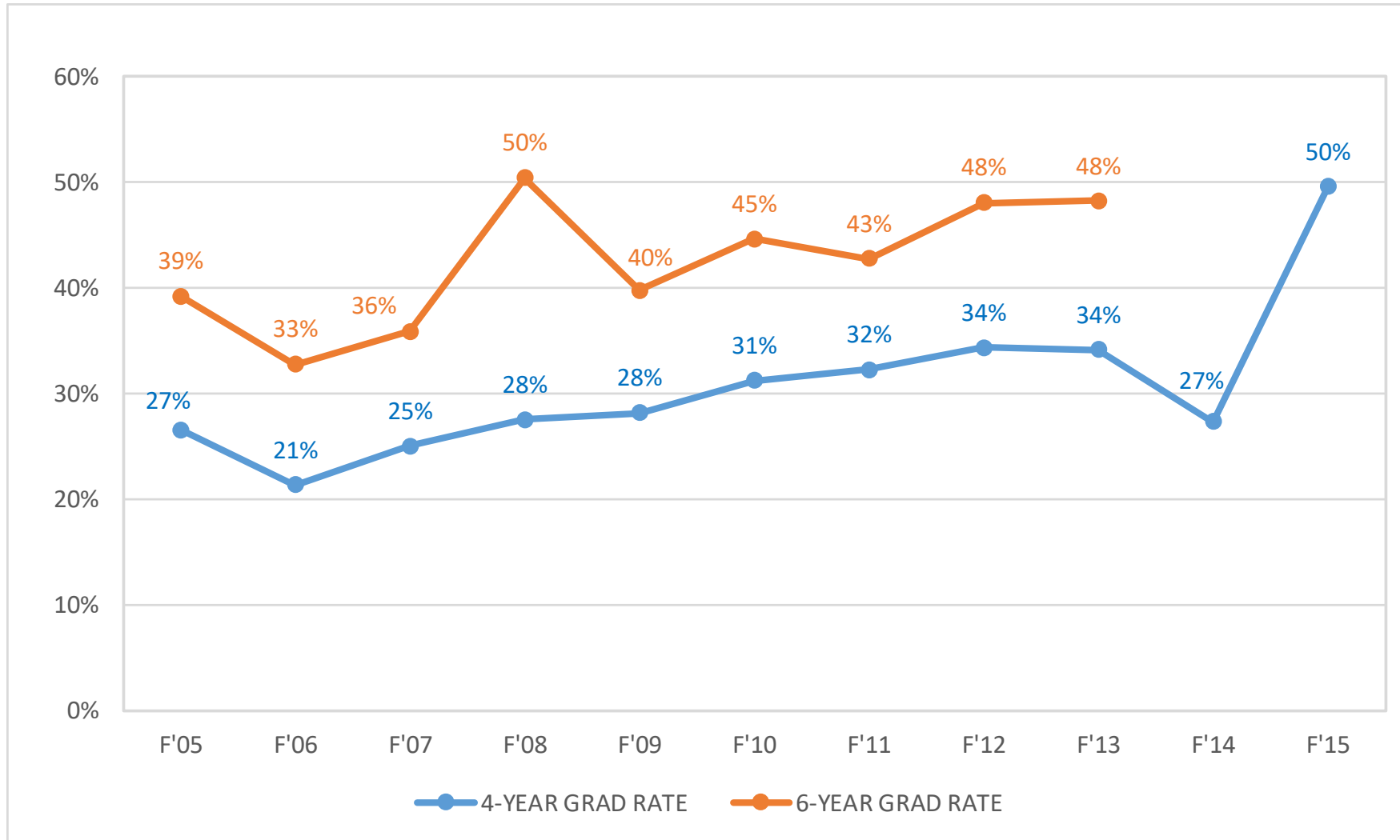

Academic Year	The period of time that begins late August and concludes the following July, equated to fall semester, spring semester, and summer session.
ACT	ACT, previously known as the American College Testing program, measures educational development and readiness to pursue college-level coursework in English, mathematics, natural science, and social studies. Student performance does not reflect innate ability and is influenced by a student's educational preparedness.
ALANA	This includes the ethnic groups of Asian, Native American/Alaska Native, Black/African American, Hispanic of Any Race, and Hawaiian/Pacific Islander.
Board Type/Meal Plan	10 meals: 10 meals per week
	14 meals: 14 meals per week
	19 meals: 19 meals per week
	GA Meal: A meal plan for other Graduate Assistants not working in housing: zero meal per week
	Meal Plan Waiver: Zero meal per week
	RA: A meal plan for Resident Assistants, same as "14 meals"
Census Date	Res. Life GA Meal: A meal plan for Resident Life Graduate Assistants, same as "14 meals"
	For institutions operating under a traditional academic year calendar, enrollment is reported as of the institution's official reporting date. At HNU, this date is about mid-October and mid-February the fall and spring semesters, respectively.
Cohort	A specific group of students established for tracking purposes. Cohorts usually consist of separate full-time or part-time groups of undergraduate or graduate students who begin college during the same given semester.
Continuing/Returning Student	A student who was enrolled prior to the previous fall or spring semester and has returned to study in the current term, regardless of the number of credit hours they have earned.
Degree-Seeking Student	A student who was admitted as degree-seeking, who has declared the pursuit of a bachelor's or master's degree and is enrolled in courses for credit.
Earned Credit	The number of credit hours a student has completed towards their degree, including transferred credits.
ex.cel	An undergraduate program that stopped offering classes since 2006.
Faculty FTE	The full-time-equivalent instructional faculty per semester is calculated by summing the total number of units taught divided by 12.
First-Time, First-Year or First-time Freshmen	A student attending any postsecondary institution for the first time at the undergraduate level. Includes students enrolled in the fall term who attended a postsecondary institution for the first time at the same level in the prior summer term. Also includes students who entered with advanced standing (college credit earned before graduation from high school).

<b>Full-Time Graduate Student</b>	A graduate student must be enrolled in 9 or more credits to be considered full-time. A Credential student must be enrolled in 12 or more credits to be considered full-time.
<b>Full-Time Undergraduate Student</b>	An undergraduate student must be enrolled in 12 or more credits to be considered full-time.
<b>Graduation Rate</b>	The percentage of students in a given cohort graduating within a time period of 4, 5 or 6 years. Six years, or 150% of normal 4-year time-to-degree, is the typical measurement for a first-time, full-time degree-seeking cohort's graduation rate. The number of students in the initial/entry cohort is the denominator of the rate; the number of students graduating is the numerator of the rate.
<b>IPEDS</b>	"IPEDS" stands for Integrated Postsecondary Education Data System. The core postsecondary education data collection program for NCES—a system of surveys designed to collect data from all primary providers of postsecondary education. IPEDS is a single, comprehensive system designed to encompass all institutions and educational organizations whose primary purpose is to provide postsecondary education. The IPEDS system is built around a series of interrelated surveys to collect institution-level data in such areas as enrollments, program completions, faculty, staff, and finances.
<b>First Year (IPEDS) Cohort</b>	The incoming first-time full-time degree seeking undergraduate group/cohort entering in fall; this is the initial/entry cohort in graduation rate calculations.
<b>Lecture</b>	An organized course offered for credit, identified by discipline and number, meeting at a stated time or times in a classroom or similar setting, and not a subsection such as a laboratory or discussion session. (All Lecture and Non-Lecture classes in Class Size Comparison excludes distance learning classes and noncredit classes and individual instruction such as dissertation or thesis research, music instruction, or one-to-one readings; excludes students in independent study, cooperative programs, internships, foreign language taped tutor sessions, practicums, and all students in one-on-one classes.)
<b>Level</b>	A student is either an undergraduate (UG or UNDR) or graduate (GR or GRAD) student. For historical data, if there is not enough information to identify a student as an undergraduate, he/she is considered as a graduate student.
<b>NEXUS</b>	For this current academic year, NEXUS refers to the RN to BSN program.
<b>Other/Unknown, Other/Special Status, or Undeclared/Special Status</b>	This is an extra category used for classifying students whose information is conflicting, missing, or not declared that can not be considered in any listed categories.
<b>Occupancy Rate</b>	Occupancy rate is the ratio of rental units rented versus the capacity -- the number of available units.
<b>Part-Time Graduate Student</b>	A graduate student enrolled for fewer than 9 credits per semester or a Credential student enrolled for fewer than 12 are considered part-time.
<b>Part-Time Undergraduate Student</b>	A student enrolled for fewer than 12 credits per semester.
<b>Race/Ethnicity</b>	Asian: A person having origins in any of the original peoples of the Far East, Southeast Asia, or the Indian Subcontinent, including, for example, Cambodia, China, India, Japan, Korea, Malaysia, Pakistan, the Philippine Islands, Thailand, and Vietnam.
	American Indian or Alaska Native: A person having origins in any of the original peoples of North and South America (including Central America) who maintains cultural identification through tribal affiliation or community attachment.

In some reports, "International" was used in place of "Nonresident Alien."
	Race/ethnicity unknown: The category used to report students or employees whose race and ethnicity are not known.
	White: A person having origins in any of the original peoples of Europe, the Middle East, or North Africa.
Retention Rate	The proportion of the number of returned students over the number of initial/entry cohort for a certain period of time expressed in percentage. The entry cohort of continuing students doesn't include students completing their programs during the period because they don't need to return.
Room Type	Apartment: A single room for Resident Life Graduate Assistant or Hall Director (bigger than a normal single room), a new room type since Fall 2013.
	Double: a double room for two students
	Double as Single: a double room for one student
	Extended Suite: 2 double rooms with a small conjunction room for four students, aka. "Suite"
	Housing Staff: Resident Assistants, Resident Life Graduate Assistants, and Housing Director
	Mini Single: a very small single room for one student

Special Post BA	"Special Post BA" stands for special post-bachelor students. This is a group of non-degree-seeking students that are taking classes above undergraduate level; they are considered as graduate students in enrollment reports.
Student Class/Rank	Class is derived from a student's earned credit hours (including HNU and transfer credits), and are as follows:
	Freshmen (FR): 0 to 29.5
	Sophomore (SO): 30 to 59.5

Similarly, the sum of all graduate part-time units divided by 9 (total part-time graduates FTE) and the head count of full-time graduate students is FTE for graduates.
Student-to-faculty ratio	The ratio of FTE students to FTE instructional staff, i.e., students divided by staff.
TRAD or Trad	Traditional Semester Undergraduate Students
Transfer Student (new transfer to HNU)	A student entering HNU for the first time but known to have previously attended another college or university at the same level (e.g., undergraduate).
UG Special Status	This is a group of non-degree-seeking students that are taking classes at undergraduate level.
