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



#### **HNU Enrollment Trend (Fall and Spring Semesters)**


Fall 2013 to Fall 2020



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
#### **Fall Enrollment Trend**

#### **Fall Enrollment and Full Time Equivalent Trend**


Fall 2010 to Fall 2020



Academic Year




